As Chairman of the Complaint Mediation Panel, I am responsible for coordinating the program on behalf of The Association of the Bar of the City of New York and serve as a member of the Coordinating Committee on Mediation Panels, consisting of the chairmen of the various bar associations participating in the program, meeting periodically with the Chief Counsel for the Departmental Disciplinary Committee for the First Judicial Department to evaluate the mediation program and review current problems.
