III. General professional experience:

I have been practicing law for nearly thirty-three (33) years, primarily as a litigator. My particular areas of expertise have included bankruptcy litigation, real estate litigation, mortgage foreclosure and other loan enforcement litigation, and workouts and restructurings, both in the contexts of bankruptcies and of real estate loan defaults

IV. General pertinent experience:

I was previously appointed by the court as an Examiner in a Chapter 11 case in the Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of New York. My charge was to examine the question of whether certain rental tenants in a cooperative apartment building were denying the Debtor, which had acquired ownership rights to the apartments occupied by those tenants, access to the apartments in order to make certain state court-mandated repairs. During the course of my investigation as Examiner, I became a de facto mediator between

the parties, and through several in-person settlement meetings and numerous telephonic communications with the parties and their counsel, facilitated a settlement between the two sides.

In addition, as frequent counsel to Chapter 7 bankruptcy trustee who is on the trustee panels of both the Southern and Eastern District of New York Bankruptcy Courts, I have participated in a number of mediations of litigation disputes to which that trustee has been party, and have thereby been able to observe first-hand what techniques of the mediator are effective, and which are not. I believe the aforesaid experience and observations, coupled with my litigation experience, would enable me to serve as an effective mediator.

VI. Pertinent bankruptcy training:

For the last decade, the overwhelming portion of my practice has involved cases in the Bankruptcy Courts for the Southern and Eastern Districts of New York. As mentioned above, I have frequently served as counsel to a Chapter 7 bankruptcy trustee in various of his trustee cases. My work on behalf of that trustee has included prosecution of avoidance claims and of claims for breaches of fiduciary duty on the part of former officers and directors of the debtor entities, Bankruptcy Code Section 363 asset sales, objections to and resolutions of claims filed against the estate, and the conducting of Bankruptcy Rule 2004 examinations of debtors and of their principals. I have also been involved in Chapter 11 restructurings, and represented certain creditors in litigation and related work in the recent Chrysler bankruptcy case.

VII. General pertinent business or legal experience:

From April 2006-April 2009, I served as President of the Brotherhood Synagogue, a 900-member congregation located in the Gramercy Park area of Manhattan. Since April 2009, and continuing at present, I have been serving as Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Synagogue. I believe I was elected to those positions because I am perceived as someone who is personable and strives for conciliation among opposing views, traits which I feel are conducive to being effective as a mediator.
