**III. General professional experience:**

I was a trial and a transaction lawyer in both a general civil practice and an intellectual property law practice from 1966 and 1965 respectively until my appointment to the bench in 1981. I had a variety of assignments as a Judge from 1981 through 2001. This included trying or settling a number of cases released from a Bankruptcy Stay for purposes of trial. I was the Supervising Judge of the Complex Civil Trial Panel in Orange County for my last five years on the Bench before retiring. Since retiring, I have been an Arbitrator and Mediator as well as a Court Appointed Special Master and a Court Appointed Referee with JAMS.

**IV. General pertinent experience:**

I have mediated several hundred cases while at JAMS. These have involved a variety of civil issues with a heavy emphasis on securities conflicts, business disputes, and a variety of intellectual property issues including anti-trust, unfair trade, and patent, trademark, and copyright disputes.

**V. Mediation training:**

I successfully completed a multi-day program at the Straus Institute sponsored by the California Judges Association. In addition, I have participated in the JAMS training sessions in Mediation practice. I also have taught various continuing legal education programs concerning various aspects of mediation for various legal groups. The participants received CLE credits for the State Bar of California.
