DISTINGUISHED BANKRUPTCY JUDGE TO RETIRE FROM SOUTHERN DISTRICT BENCH

The United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York announces that Chief Bankruptcy Judge Martin Glenn has declared his intention to retire on September 30, 2026.

Chief Judge Glenn joined the Southern District bench on November 30, 2006, and was appointed as Chief Judge on March 1, 2022. During his tenure, he has presided over many notable cases, including Avanti Communications Group PLC; Avianca Holdings S.A.; Celsius Network; Frontier Communication Corp; GOL Linhas Aéreas Inteligentes S.A.; Lehman Brothers Holdings; Metcalfe & Mansfield; MF Global Holdings; Residential Capital, LLC; The Roman Catholic Diocese of Rockville Centre; and SVB Financial Group.

Chief Judge Glenn is a fellow of the American College of Bankruptcy and a member of the American Law Institute; International Insolvency Institute; New York Federal-State Judicial Council; New York City Bar; National Conference of Bankruptcy Judges; and American Bankruptcy Institute. He is a past member of the Committee on International Judicial Relations of the United States Judicial Conference, and the Bankruptcy Judge Advisory Group of the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts.

Judge Glenn is an Adjunct Professor at Columbia Law School.

Until his retirement date, Chief Judge Glenn will continue to preside over cases. Chief Judge Glenn's judicial vacancy will be filled by the Second Circuit.
