This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Wai Laam Lui (the "Applicant") for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access Fee Schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds, based upon the attached letter received on March 12, 2025, that the Applicant has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.

Accordingly, the Applicant shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court to the extent such use is incurred in connection with the project described in the attached letter and application. The Applicant shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

I am conducting a research project that examines the composition and impact of ad hoc creditor groups in large Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings. In this research, I need to examine a significant number of dockets filed by many constituents of the proceedings, including the debtor, official creditor committees, ad hoc committees, and the court. From docket contents, I aim to (1) extract the composition of ad hoc groups, (2) document and categorize their actions and positions, and (3) analyze their impact on court dynamics, especially regarding valuations. The dockets are the authoritative and exclusive source for such research.

Large bankruptcy cases routinely log hundreds if not thousands of docket filings, and many key documents such as plans of reorganization, motions, and evidence and testimony exhibits, could routinely span hundreds of pages as well. Consequently, just in a single major case, the documents that may harbor relevant information could reach thousands if not tens of thousands of pages. In aggregate, studying many large cases will incur prohibitive costs if not given an exemption.
